TPFF Celebrated its Sixth Year Anniversary on November 22, 2023!

Hello Lesmah,

What a journey it has been! We offered our first program, "Dance is Healing" (DIH) in December 2018 at Mind-Builders Creative Arts Center in the Bronx. With professional dancers as instructors, our first cohort of participants included one who went on to perform at the Metropolitan Opera and another who is currently studying at Juilliard, class of 2026.

We knew from the start that we needed to do more for our community, so the next year, we offered a second version of DIH at the Alvin Ailey Dance Studios in Manhattan.

During the height of the Covid-19 pandemic, we developed virtual programs and workshops like the "Spine Series", and theater programs such as "Stars 2 Be", and "Virtual Variations of the Nutcracker." From just one dance program in our first year, this year we offered a total of 15 programs in Dance, Theater, Music, Visual Arts, Folk & Traditional Arts, and Wellness. This could not have been accomplished without the generous help of our donors, supporters, and grants from NYSCA, NYC Cultural Affairs, and the Bronx Council on the Arts.

We had our first annual TPFF "Community Matters" Gala and Award Ceremony in October. This event, held at the historic New York Academy of Medicine (NYAM), shared highlights of our community work for the past 6 years. We paid tribute to three distinguished community leaders, Dr. Rosa M. Gil, Madaha Kinsey-Lamb, and Dr. Michael G. Vitale. The event's Emcee was Errol Barnett, Emmy Award Winning Anchor and National Correspondent, CBS News. The evening included performances by Pearl Khwezi, Broadway Actor, and Walter Russell III, Actor, Singer, Grammy Award Winner. Pearl and Walter thrilled the audience with their song and dance and a feeling of community and support was felt by all. What a wonderful six years it has been!

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
Highlights from November


"Reading the Body: Recovery" a Short Film
